

Homework Activities for Summer Term (1st Half)

Reading

Please continue to read with your child every day or at least three times each week and sign their 100 square in the back of the Reading Journal. We will be rewarding children for their home daily reading each time your child has completed 25, 50 75 and 100 reads!

Remember to discuss your child's book with them and encourage them to ask and answer questions about the characters, what might happen next and the setting. Encourage them to explain their ideas and describe how different aspects of the story relate to their own life.

We will now be sending home a Reading Comprehension booklet each week. Your child will get 5 house points if they bring back a completed comprehension!

Maths

This half term we will be learning about Mass, Capacity and Temperature. It would be lovely if you could spend time at home measuring any of these. For mass, help your child to weigh different objects. Talk about which is heavier? Which is lighter? Weigh using scales – how many grams does your item weigh? For capacity, your child could enjoy some water play. Talk about whether a container is full or empty, or compare different containers. Use a measuring jug to measure the water from a container – how many ml does it hold? For temperature, you could talk about the change in weather. Look at the temperature each day. What do the children notice?

Please continue to work on the four operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Encourage your child to talk about how they got the answer.

e.g. $46 + 21 =$
 $65 - 22 =$
 $4 \times 5 =$
 $12 \div 2 =$

PSHE

We will be learning all about money this half term. When you are out and about, you can help your child by talking about how we use money – how we pay, how we buy what we need, and how we can save for things we would like.

Geography

In Geography, we will be learning about coasts. Why not visit the beach in Bognor or Felpham? Talk about the features you see on your journey and while you are there, such as shops, cafes, parks, pubs, beach huts and houses. You could even use Google Earth to look at other coasts in the UK, such as those you may have visited, or would like to visit one day.



We are planning to visit Felpham Beach after May half term – more details to follow at a later date.

Science

In science we will be learning about living things and habitats. The children will be learning about the different habitats in the United Kingdom including coastal, woodland, urban and pond habitats. Your child will become experts on these types of habitats and could make you a booklet about their favourite habitat and what lives and grows there.

Art

In art we are working with clay to design and make a clay house. Could your child sketch a picture of your house to help with your design?
